The Providence College *Digital Commons* is...

An Institutional Repository: A home for unpublished papers, locally-owned journals, ancillary research, and other "invisible" materials. The *Digital Commons* provides a national & international audience that might otherwise not discover these materials. Since implementation in 2006, **over 16,000 articles** have been downloaded from the Providence College *Digital Commons*.

An Open Archive: All materials added to the *Digital Commons* are freely available to anyone with web access. Each article is fully indexed by major search engines such as Google, as well as a variety of specialized directories.

In 2008, Google sent 6,832 visitors to the PC *Digital Commons*, including referrals from International Google sites such as Google UK, Google Belgium, Google India, Google Germany, and many more.

The Providence College *Digital Commons* provides...

Monthly Usage Statistics: Each month every author automatically receives an e-mail including monthly and cumulative download statistics for all articles they have in the *Digital Commons*. Additional statistics, such as referral information, can also be provided upon request.

Supplemental Materials: In addition to the main article, supplemental materials (such as spreadsheets, data sets, related research notes, and more) can be uploaded.

Processing & Digitization Services: The staff of the Digital Services Lab will handle all processing, description, and submission of materials into the *Digital Commons*.
