The program emphasizes an appreciation of the Judeo-Christian heritage in keeping with the character and mission of the College as a Catholic and Dominican institution. It also promotes an understanding of democratic tradition and practice and their relation to the responsibilities of citizenship and humane development of the nation and the world.
