Parents Leadership Council

Parents Leadership Council members are considered ambassadors for the College and the parent community. Council members are asked to share their perspective as parents with College leaders and speak with fellow parents on behalf of Providence College. Members lead the efforts of the Parents Fund, assist during Upperclassman and Freshman Family Weekends, and host incoming freshman receptions and regional parent cultivation and stewardship events.

Specific responsibilities may include, but are not limited to:

- One-year renewable term.
- Support the Parents Fund with an annual gift at the St. Dominic Society Level and/or assist the College in securing funds for capital projects.
- Engage parents as resources within the PC community through opportunities in Career Services and Admissions as well as regional events.
- Encourage annual giving to the Parents Fund by contacting other parents primarily through written correspondence and personal outreach.
- Serve as representatives of the Parents for Providence Association during Freshman and Upperclassman Family Weekend activities and move-in weekend.
- Outreach to parents, especially of incoming freshmen, by phone and through events organized with the Office of Alumni Relations.
- Serve as spokespeople for the Parents for Providence Association (i.e. inclusion in literature or website, brief comments at events).
- Attend two on-campus meetings, as well as periodic conference calls.
- Collaborate with the Director of Parent Programs, in the Dean's Office, and Institutional Advancement, in order to enhance parent communications.
- Host and attend regional parent cultivation and stewardship events including invitation only events with College President.
- Encourage national participation in both the Association and the Council by recruiting parents who live outside New England.
