

Clayton Dodge Receives the C.C. MacDuffee Award

After 20 years of service as Problems Editor of the Pi Mu Epsilon Journal, Clayton Dodge is stepping done. In recognition of his outstanding contributions, he was awarded the C. C. MacDuffee Award for Distinguished Service on August 4, 2001 at the Annual Meeting of Pi Mu Epsilon held in Madison, Wisconsin. Clayton taught at UMaine-Orono for many years and was the second recipient of this Section's Howard Eves Award which was appropriate since Howard Eves was his mentor at UMaine. In his twenty years, he has handled over 500 problems starting with problem #462 and ending with problem #1006.
