- ACT (middle 50%) 23-28

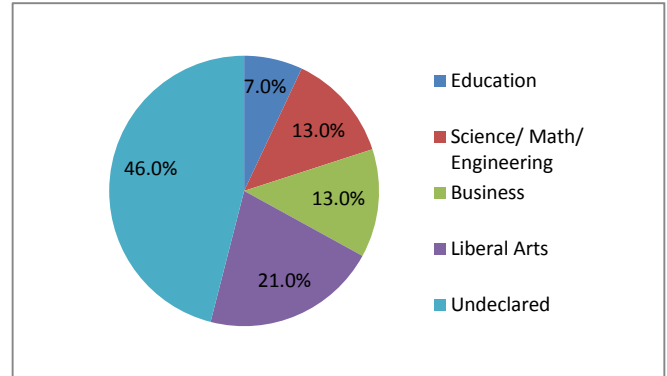
Curriculum Overview

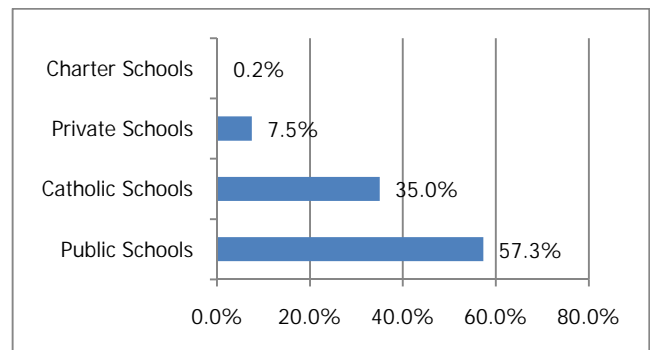

The development of Western Civilization Program (DWC) is the cornerstone of the Providence College core curriculum. It is a two-year, interdisciplinary program which provides students with a powerful overview of cultural, philosophical and theological debates and discourses that shape societies. Because all freshman and sophomore students are required to take DWC, it is the largest class offered at Providence College.

The Core Curriculum Requirements are:

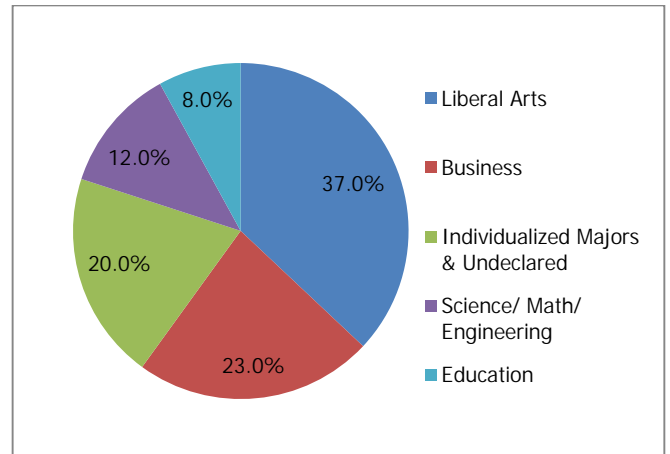

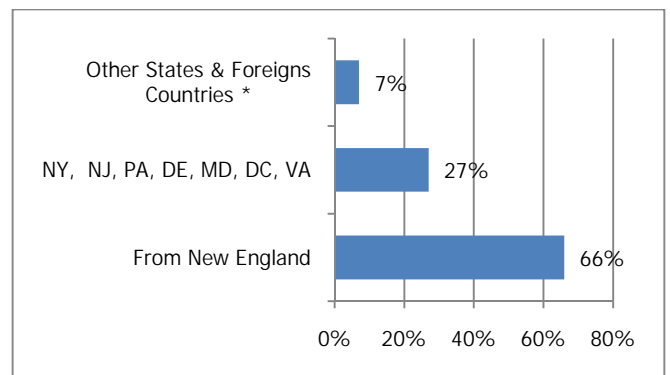
Academic Majors
